Fraud Repression through Education 2 (FRED2) represents a collaborative initiative between the ImpreSapiens research center at the University of Rome "La Sapienza" and the COLAF, serving as the technical secretariat of the Committee to combat fraud against the European Union. Positioned within the framework of the Union Anti-Fraud Program (EAUF), FRED2 seeks to enhance synergy between the academic sphere and the EU Anti-Fraud Coordination Services (AFCOS), specifically concerning European Funds. This is achieved through the sharing of best practices and the establishment of a permanent European anti-fraud observatory.

The project is based on a cross-disciplinary approach that includes practical activities such as workshops and study visits, as well as theoretical enrichment through webinars and seminars. These activities aim to develop participants' knowledge of the misuse of European funds and the strategies for controlling and preventing fraud. The project has the support of Italian and European partners in the project network.

The FRED2 project involves task forces composed of both academic and professional members who work together to identify new strategies for controlling and preventing fraud in the context of EU funding. One of the main goal of this approach is the collaboration with the European Anti-Fraud observatory, which through periodic reports on the National Recovery and Resilience Plans (PNRR) of various EU countries:
